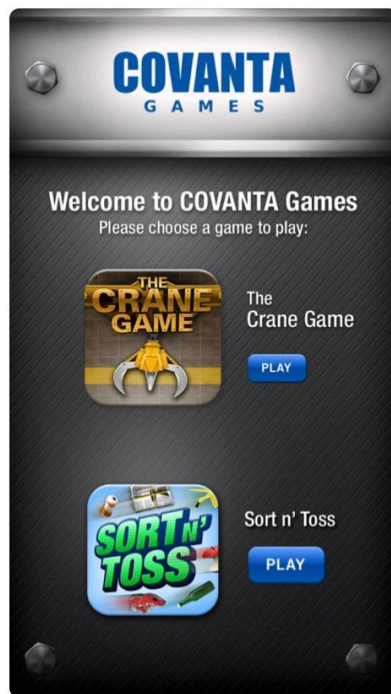

Background:

The majority of Lancaster County’s municipal solid waste is taken to the Lancaster Waste-to-Energy (WTE) Facility, located in Conoy Township. Built in 1991, this facility’s primary purpose is to burn combustible waste to reduce waste volume and save landfill capacity, provide clean energy, recover materials and create steam. The Lancaster WTE Facility is permitted to process up to 1,200 tons of waste per day.

LCSWMA also owns the Susquehanna Resource Management Complex (SRMC), located in Harrisburg. The SRMC is home to the nation’s first waste-to-energy (WTE) facility. Built in 1972, and retrofitted in 2007, this facility saves landfill capacity and creates clean energy by combusting trash. The SRMC is permitted to process up to 800 tons of waste per day.

LCSWMA contracts with **Covanta Energy** to operate both facilities 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
